

About the “Citizens’ Commission on Nuclear Energy (CCNE)”

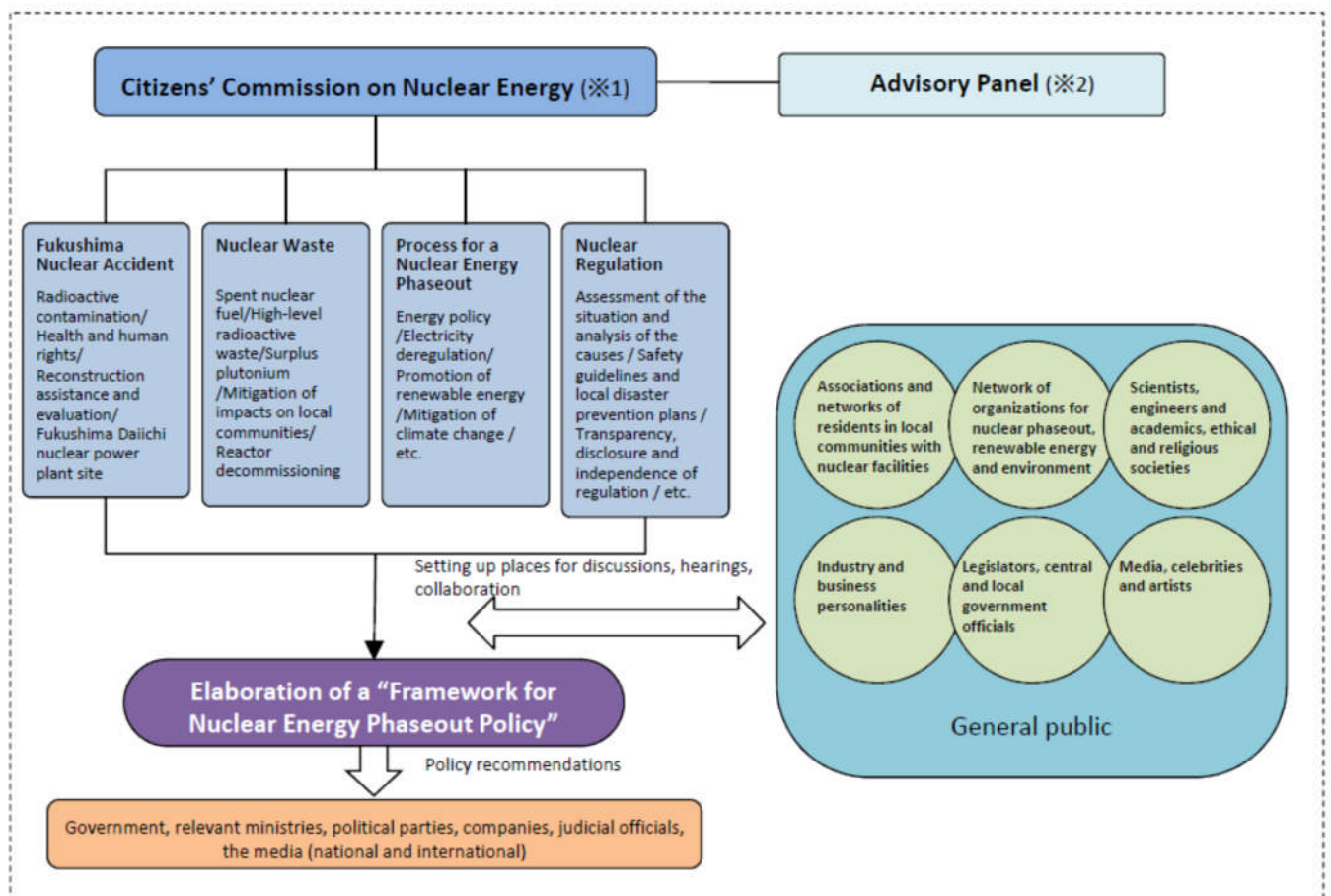
1. Objectives

4. Names of sections and the respective subjects they address

Name of sections

- (1) Section on the Fukushima Nuclear Accident and Assistance to Victims (Section on Fukushima Accident)
- (2) Section on Nuclear Waste
- (3) Section on the Process for a Nuclear Energy Phaseout
- (4) Section on Nuclear Regulation

Subjects addressed by sections

- (1) What measures are required to rehabilitate the disaster area and to support the victims of the TEPCO Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant accident?
- (2) How should the spent nuclear fuel and nuclear wastes be managed?
- (3) What concrete process should be followed in order to construct a society free of nuclear energy?
- (4) Premised on a phase out of nuclear energy, what nuclear regulation is required?

5. Activity schedule (subject to change)

- April 15, 2013 : Inauguration
- September 2013 : Announcement of draft outline of the “Framework for Nuclear Energy Phaseout Policy”
- March 2014 : Publication of the first “Framework for Nuclear Energy Phaseout Policy” (to be updated every year)
- At any time of the year, occasional policy recommendations, workshop events, and other activities will be undertaken as needed.

(The Commission will meet about once a month, while the sections are to be held at any time as necessary.)
